

FY18 Expense Budget Highlights

- FY18's proposed budgeted expense is \$2,219,517.23 which is a decrease of \$116,667 or 4.99% from current year budgeted expense.
 - Elementary Reg. Ed Expenses increased by \$60,371 or 5%.
 - Secondary Reg. Ed Expenses decreased by \$46,225 or 7%.
 - Elementary & Secondary Special Ed. Expenses decreased by \$130,813 or 28%

FY18 Est. Revenue

- Local revenues are estimated at \$260,258 which is a decrease from prior year of \$427,855 or 39%
 - The decrease is due to 2 main causes:
 - 1. A majority of special ed. expense and revenue has moved to the Supervisory union and only the net expense is being passed down to the district. This change has a decrease in both the special ed. revenue and expense at the district level, but does not effect the overall net cost to the district.
 - 2. Similar to special ed., transportation expense and revenue has moved to the Supervisory union and only the net expense is being passed down to the district. This change has a decrease in both the transportation revenue and expense at the district level, but does not effect the overall net cost to the district.

FY18 Education Spending

- Education Spending is one of the main factors that determines your local tax rate.
- Education Spending is a calculation of Budgeted Expense minus Local Revenues = Total Education Spending.
- FY18 Est. Education Spending is \$1,959,259, an increase of \$50,929.

Budget Highlights

- Equalized pupils increased from 149.95 to 151.83
- Education spending per equalized pupil will be \$12,904, an increase of \$210 per pupil.
- The state yield is estimated to increase from \$9,701 to \$10,076, this increase in the yield will drive down local tax rates.
- The CLA has decreased from 104.84 to 104.33, resulting in an Estimated Homestead Tax Rate of \$1.22, which will be \$0.02 lower than the current year.
- This is equivalent to approx. a \$20 decrease per year for a homestead assessment of \$100,000 before any income sensitivity adjustments.
